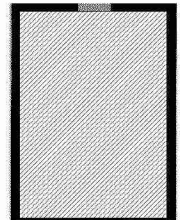
Balboa Park is just one of the many arts destinations, with museums dedicated to the history of mankind, photography, aviation, art, cars, sports, railroads and more.

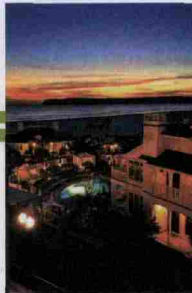
**BREAKFAST // Pannikin Coffee & Tea**

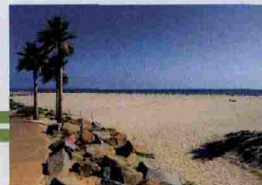

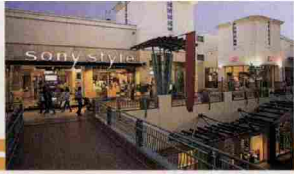
## Lovebirds
